The Sustainable Energy Authority of Ireland (SEAI) is calling on community groups across Ireland to join the dedicated 'Sustainable Energy Community' (SEC) Network. The aim of the Network is to catalyse and support a national movement of SECs operating in every part of the country.

What is a Sustainable Energy Community?

- A Sustainable Energy Community (SEC) is a community in which everyone works together to develop a sustainable energy system. To do so, they aim as far as possible to be energy efficient, to use renewable energy where feasible and to develop decentralised energy supplies.
- A SEC can include all the different energy users in the community including homes, sports clubs, community centres, churches and businesses.
- SEC's are now being encouraged to join the new SEAI supported SEC Network to help build capacity and share skills across communities.

Why become a Sustainable Energy Community?

- Achieve financial + energy savings
- Improve public wellbeing through enhanced comfort from energy efficient buildings
- Boost local employment
- Promote community building through partnership approach
- Build capacity and leverage funding
- Contribute to national energy reduction targets

What are the benefits of the SEC Network?

- Provides groups with the opportunity to **share knowledge and insight** and to meet with other members who are carrying out a diversity of energy efficiency projects.
- Is operated by 'champions' from Sustainable Energy Communities with SEAI support. This means Network events and supports are **designed with and for members**.
- Enables your group to **access technical supports** to guide you through a structured process of identifying and carrying out sustainable energy initiatives in your community.
- Means your group will be **eligible to apply for dedicated SEAI funding** to realise your sustainable energy ambitions.

Who can join the SEC Network?

A large number of groups are encouraged to join the SEC Network. This includes:

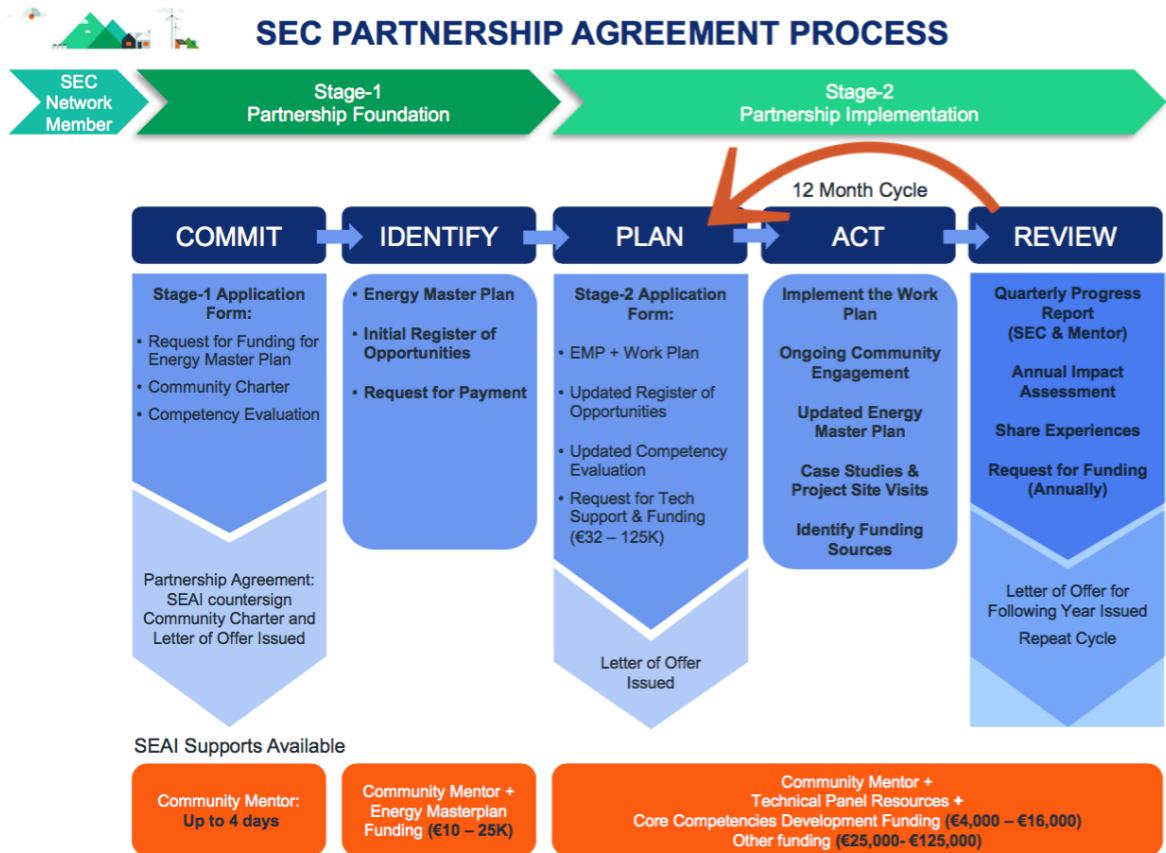
- Existing groups** who may have already availed of SEAI Better Energy Communities or Area Based supports and want to further their ambitions.
- Interested groups** who want to start the journey towards becoming a Sustainable Energy Community by availing of Network supports.



Looking forward

By joining the Network, you are indicating your groups' commitment to knowledge sharing with SEC members and to developing and implementing sustainable energy initiatives. You will have the option to enter into a three-year Partnership Agreement with SEAI. Over this three year timeframe, your group can access SEAI technical supports to help you to establish a baseline Energy Masterplan, identify energy saving opportunities, implement a tailored programme of activities for your community, monitor the programme's progress and review accordingly. You may also apply for dedicated SEAI funding to help your group to achieve your SEC ambitions.

How to sign up to the Network...

Establish your group

- The first step is to establish your group.
- Groups should encourage a wide range of energy users to participate in the SEC and demonstrate an inclusive approach to public, private and community sectors.

Complete SEC Network registration form

- Once you have established your group, complete and **submit the short registration form** overleaf to join the SEC Network
- Applications are welcomed throughout the year. There is no deadline.**
