Community Charter

A community charter is a one-page overview of your Sustainable Energy Community's (SEC) vision and aims, briefly outlining your objectives and commitments to action.

It is signed on behalf of your SEC by nominated steering committee members but is not a legal document. It is a communications tool representing the collective ambition of your SEC. Building from the skills assessment and opportunity mapping exercise, this document provides:

- Guidance on developing your community charter.
- A template that you can edit online or print.
- An example of a completed charter to guide you.

Key elements to building your community charter

Your community charter should be created to suit your community's unique needs and vision.

To get you started, we have outlined key elements to create your charter and a mock-up example template.

This information is intended to serve as a guideline rather than a blueprint, so adapt to your preferred style.

Vision Statement: Our vision is...

If you want to engage with your wider community and have others to join with you, you must start with a clear vision.

This is a one-sentence, aspirational statement describing how your community will be different in the long-term as a result of establishing the Sustainable Energy Community.

A useful visioning question to answer is: How will your community look, feel and act if your SEC is successful?

Mission Statement: Our mission is...

A mission should be grounded more in real terms of achievable and measurable impact you can make.

This is the 'how' part: how your SEC will go about making your vision a reality.

Our Goals: We aim to...

An explanation on the initiatives and high-level goals your SEC plans to pursue to achieve your vision.

Your goals are a list of targets or outcomes you plan to deliver and should be SMART:

- **S**pecific (simple, sensible, significant).
- Measurable (meaningful, motivational).
- Achievable (agreed, attainable).
- **R**elevant (reasonable, realistic and resourced, results-based).
- Time bound (time-based, time/cost limited, timely, time-sensitive).

Our Actions: We will deliver this through.... Outline tangible actions you will demonstrate in the community. Utilising skills assessment and opportunity mapping can be useful for this section in outlining the actions you are planning to take.

- Host and attend online and in person events that are relevant to the community to educate and inform on steps they can take in their daily lives.
- Demonstrate uptake of energy efficiency projects and initiatives in our community to reduce our carbon emissions.

Sharing impact

• Promoting our work and the theme of sustainable energy across the community and SEC network.
