Why should your organisation join the SEAI Public Sector Decarbonisation Partnership Programme?

Irish Public Bodies are committed to reducing energy-related emissions by 51% and increasing energy efficiency to 50% by 2030. This requires the entire organisation's commitment to rethinking how public services are delivered with improved energy efficiency and reduced emissions. Key to this will be the engagement of staff, supply chains and the public.

Under the Government's Climate Action Plan, Ireland must reduce its energy-related carbon emissions from 60 million to 30 million tonnes by 2030. This is a milestone to achieving net zero by 2050.

Your energy related decarbonisation journey will play a key part in your organisation's climate action, and is essential to your exemplar role within the Public Sector.

SEAI is committed to working with the public sector to achieve these targets by providing the advice and mentoring, technical supports, strategic advice, reporting frameworks and networking opportunities that public bodies need.

What supports will your organisation get by joining SEAI's Public Sector Decarbonisation Partnership Programme

The Sustainable Energy Authority of Ireland (SEAI) understands that Public Bodies are at different stages of their energy management journey and have different needs and capacity.

SEAI has developed a Partnership Programme to provide dedicated tailored supports to Public Bodies that have top level commitment to delivering on their targets as soon as possible.

Alongside the wider suite of SEAI supports, Public Bodies that commit to SEAI's Partnership Programme receive a dedicated SEAI-appointed technical expert. This expert will help guide your organisation on its decarbonisation journey and help provide links to pathfinder capital supports enabling scale.

What does participating in the Partnership Programme with SEAI look like for your organisation?

The SEAI Partnership Programme is open to all public bodies to avail of supports and is easy to join.

Join Partnership:

- Sign up to the SEAI Partnership Programme, at CEO or equivalent level, to formally commit to partnership with SEAI and to achieve your targets.
- SEAI appoints your organisation with a Partnership Support Manager. The Partnership Support Manager is a technical expert who will provide technical input and support. An initial assessment will be undertaken of your energy management status to identify where support will be of most use.

The Partnership Cycle:

- Ongoing engagement with leadership within your organisation, including CEO, EPO (Director level) and Energy Teams, across three main elements on your 2030 journey:
 - Embedding an appropriate energy management programme.
 - Developing a project pipeline towards 2030 energy-related targets and planning strategically towards 2050.
 - Reporting annually on your organisation and building stock energy performance.
- Undertaking an annual review of your energy-related critical success factors. These are essential to getting started and maintaining momentum for long-term success. From this review SEAI will tailor supports to your organisation.
- Working with SEAI to promote your decarbonisation journey to government, public sector colleagues, the public and the marketplace.
